Peace! Among the sixteen documents of the Second Vatican council (1962-1965) is the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, *Gaudium et spes*. In an earlier project published as *Dogmatic Questions and Answers for the Year of Faith* (Charlestown, SC: Createspace, 2012) the three constitutions on the Church, on Divine Revelation and on the Sacred Liturgy (*Lumen Gentium, Dei Verbum,* and *Sacrosanctum Concilium* respectively) were considered. The following questions and answers have been drawn up in anticipation of the 60th anniversary of *Gaudium et spes* in 2025.

497. What will incline citizens to feel inclined to take part in the activities of the various groups which make up the social body (GS, 31.3)?

The offer of advantages which will attract members and dispose them to serve others

498. In whose hands does the future of humanity lie (GS, 31.3)?

Those who are strong enough to provide coming generations with reasons for living and hoping

499. For what did God not create man (GS, 32)? Life in isolation

500. For what did God create man (GS, 32)?
The formation of social unity

- 501. What pleased God in making us and saving us (GS, 32)?

 To do so not merely as individuals, but by making a single people who acknowledge Him in truth
- 502. Since when has God chosen people not just as individuals but as members of a certain community (GS, 32)? From the beginning of salvation history
- 503. What two things has God done for His chosen people (Exodus 3:7; GS, 32)? Revealed His mind to them and made a covenant with them on Sinai
