During our visit to Rome, I had the opportunity to visit the Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of Rome's four major basilicas. From the rooftop of my hotel, I watched the Angelus and had small medals of Pope Francis and the Vatican blessed. I will have these blessed medals available at this weekend's Masses for anyone who would like one. I encourage you to take one as a reminder to pray for our Church, Pope Francis, the Diocese of Knoxville, our soon-to-be bishop Mark Beckman, our parish here at St. Mary Athens, and finally, I humbly ask that you pray for me, just as I will continue to pray for you and all the people of St. Mary. May Mary watch over all of us and lead us into a deeper relationship with her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

The **One Heart Colombia Mission** Team would like to ***thank everyone*** for all of their support.

The Mission was ... June 17 – 27, 2024 in Marsella – Colombia, South America. The Team was able to successfully disperse 250 Food Bags to the poorest of the poor. They went to Mass Daily with the locals and prayed with the Families, whom they visited in their Homes. The Team also did a Vacation Bible School (VBS) for 150 of the poorest children. The Theme was – God's Love is Healing, Forgiving and Everlasting. The Mission Team was able to once again bring "Hope" to this small Village, high in the Andes Mountains, by being the Hands, Feet, Face and Heart of Jesus. The Team was able to serve the Lord, through the poor. *Matthew 25: 35 – 45* (The 7 Missionaries represented 4 different Parishes within our Diocese of Knoxville. St. Francis of Assisi- Townsend, TN; St. Therese of Lisieux - Cleveland, TN; St. Mary's – Athens, TN and St. Mary's in Johnson City – TN).

From the Columbarium committee.....

Below are selected excerpts from the US Conference of Catholic Bishops website

In April 1997, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments granted an indult for the United States to allow the diocesan bishop to permit the presence of the cremated remains of a body at a Funeral Mass.

The practice of cremation has grown and become more commonplace in the United States, and it is often presented as a more affordable alternative to traditional burial. What is often overlooked is the Church's teaching regarding the respect and honor due to the human body.

The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, and the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground, or keeping cremated remains on the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires. Safe Reminder – To Everyone that Volunteers in a parish group. To

comply with the USCCB Charter and Norms, the Diocese of Knoxville’s Safe Environment Program requires all clergy, employees, contracted school personnel, volunteers, members of groups and organizations, over the age of 18, who work, volunteer, or participate in any capacity to complete the Diocesan Safe Environment training and have a criminal background check before they may begin employment, volunteer, or participate with ministries, groups and organizations.

In addition, the mandatory renewal training must be completed every 5 years and a new background check submitted before the 5-year expiration of prior training. The Diocese of Knoxville Safe Environment compliance training and renewal training is a condition of employment and for volunteer ministry in the Diocese of Knoxville.

Please follow the steps below to register and complete the required training and background check:

- 1 Visit <https://dioknox.or/safe-environment/>
- 2 Click on the link that best describes your relationship to the parish.
- 3 If you have not had a background check since July 2018, please also complete the background check after completing the required training.
4. Once your training is complete, please download the completion certificate and forward a copy to the parish office.
